A REPORT ON INTERNATIONAL AIDS DAY AWARENESS

December 1 is designated as World AIDS Day by UNAIDS, with the slogan "*Hands up for Prevention*" as the focus. Each community has the chance to come together to assist those living with HIV, show their respect for those who have passed away, and unify in the fight against HIV. Since 1988, December 1 has been declared as World AIDS Day, a worldwide day devoted to spreading awareness of the AIDS pandemic caused by the spread of HIV infection and grieving those who have perished from the disease. In order to improve society, the NSS Unit of SIPS organises these awareness events on a monthly basis. NSS volunteers have been spreading the word about HIV and AIDS through street theatre, slogans, and advice on how to take the proper precautions. Both sex education and AIDS awareness were important topics that the principal, Dr. L.B. Borse, had brought up. In his remarks, he emphasises the value of NSS in social education. Dr. Sarika M.
