Event/Activity Report:

Introduction:

MakeIntern, as the official workshop partner, organized the Zonal Championship at IIT Delhi, which served as a significant platform for the exchange of ideas, innovation, and

learning among students from all across the nation. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from over 52 teams representing various regions of India.

Event Overview:

The Zonal Championship was held at IIT Delhi and commenced with an Inaugural Session from 9:30 AM to 10:00 AM, setting the tone for the day. Subsequently, the participants engaged in rigorous presentation sessions on shared problem statements from 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

Day 2 Activities:

On the second day of the competition, participants received a case study related to the pharmaceutical industry. The case study presented a real-world scenario with key challenges faced by a pharmaceutical company. Teams were given a total of one hour to review the case study, analyze the key problems, and develop comprehensive solutions. During this period, participants did not have access to mobile phones or any external materials.

Presentation and Evaluation:

After the one-hour analysis, each team presented their solution to a panel of jurors in a closed room. Presentations, whether oral or paper-based, were required to be concise and focused, with a maximum duration of 10 minutes. Following each presentation, a brief Q&A session with the jurors ensued.

Juror Evaluation Criteria:

The jurors evaluated the presentations based on the following criteria:

1. Identification of key issues/challenges: Teams were assessed on their ability to identify and address the primary challenges presented in the case study.
2. Innovative thinking in problem-solving: The extent to which teams demonstrated creativity and innovation in devising solutions was evaluated.
3. Presentation skills: The clarity, coherence, and effectiveness of the presentation delivery were considered.
4. Q&A: Teams' ability to respond to questions from the jurors effectively and convincingly was also taken into account.

Conclusion:

The Zonal Championship organized by Make Intern at IIT Delhi proved to be a successful event, fostering collaboration, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills among participating students. The event provided a valuable platform for students to showcase their talents and innovative ideas in addressing real-world challenges faced by the pharmaceutical
