Event/Activity Report

The "Swachhata Hi Seva" campaign was successfully implemented from September 17 to October 1, 2024, focusing on the theme "Swabhav Swachhata - Sanskar Swachhata." This initiative emphasized cleanliness as a fundamental service to society and aimed to raise awareness about cleanliness and public sanitation while actively engaging the community in responsible environmental practices. Organized by the NSS volunteers of Sandip Foundation's Sandip Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences in Nashik, the campaign fostered a sense of responsibility towards maintaining a clean environment.

One of the significant highlights of the campaign was the Ganesh Idol Collection event held on September 17, 2024, coinciding with the Ganesh Visarjan festival. This initiative aimed to mitigate pollution in local rivers caused by the immersion of idols made from non-biodegradable materials. Coordinated by Prof. Shankar Yelmame, 50 enthusiastic NSS volunteers gathered at Naroshankar Temple, Godavari Ghat, Panchvati, to collect idols and educate the community about eco-friendly practices. Principal Dr. Laxmikant Borse stated that the event exemplified the



institution's commitment to environmental sustainability and community engagement, fostering a greener future for all.

Throughout the campaign, various activities were organized to promote the message of cleanliness, including a series of engaging competitions that encouraged participation from students and the community. On September 20, 2024, a Jingle Competition was held, focusing on advertisements that promote cleanliness. The following day, September 21, a Quiz Competition centered around general knowledge engaged participants further. On September 23, a Street Play Competition took place, featuring topics such as organ donation, de-addiction, the importance of yoga, zero waste management, population control, and gender sensitization. The same day also saw an Essay Writing Competition with themes including organ donation, stress management among college students, and the role of family and society in supporting mental health.

Additionally, on September 24, 2024, a Slogan Competition was organized, highlighting the role of pharmacists in patient care and the value of organ donation. A Poster Competition was also held, featuring topics like the future of pharmacy and solutions for youth addiction. On September 26, a Drawing Competition focused on breaking the stigma surrounding mental health and pharmacists. Alongside these competitions, a Cleanliness Drive and a Tree Plantation Programme were organized to promote community cleanup activities and environmental sustainability through tree planting.

Local residents actively participated in cleanliness drives alongside NSS volunteers, reinforcing the message of collective responsibility and fostering a sense of community ownership over the cleanliness initiative. The campaign culminated in the celebration of "Swachh Bharat Diwas" on October 2, 2024. Cleaning efforts were organized at key locations, including temple premises, village Panchayat areas, Talathi office areas, secondary school grounds, and Zilla Parishad Primary School premises. Volunteers and community members worked together to clean these areas and collect plastic waste, further promoting environmental responsibility.

In conclusion, the "Swachhata Hi Seva" campaign effectively raised awareness about cleanliness and demonstrated the power of collective action. The initiatives, particularly the Ganesh Idol Collection event and various competitions, showcased the commitment of the Sandip Institute of

Pharmaceutical Sciences to environmental sustainability and community engagement. The collaborative efforts contributed to a cleaner and healthier environment for future generations, emphasizing the importance of cleanliness as a societal responsibility.

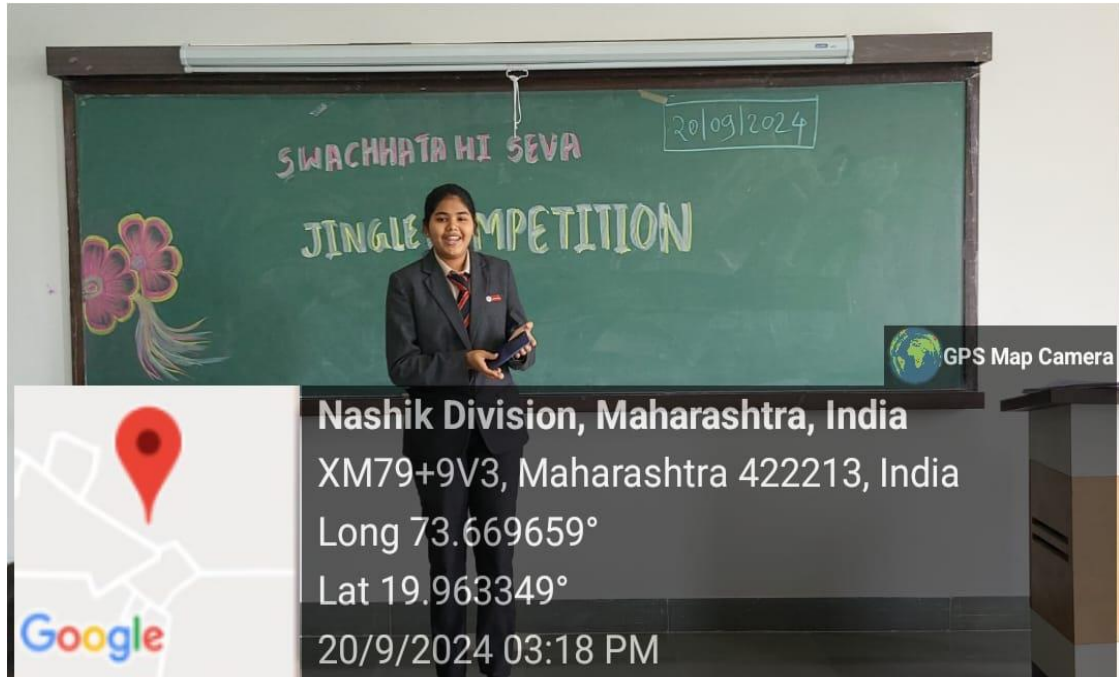

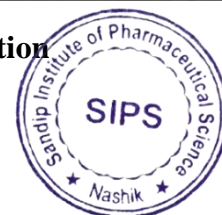

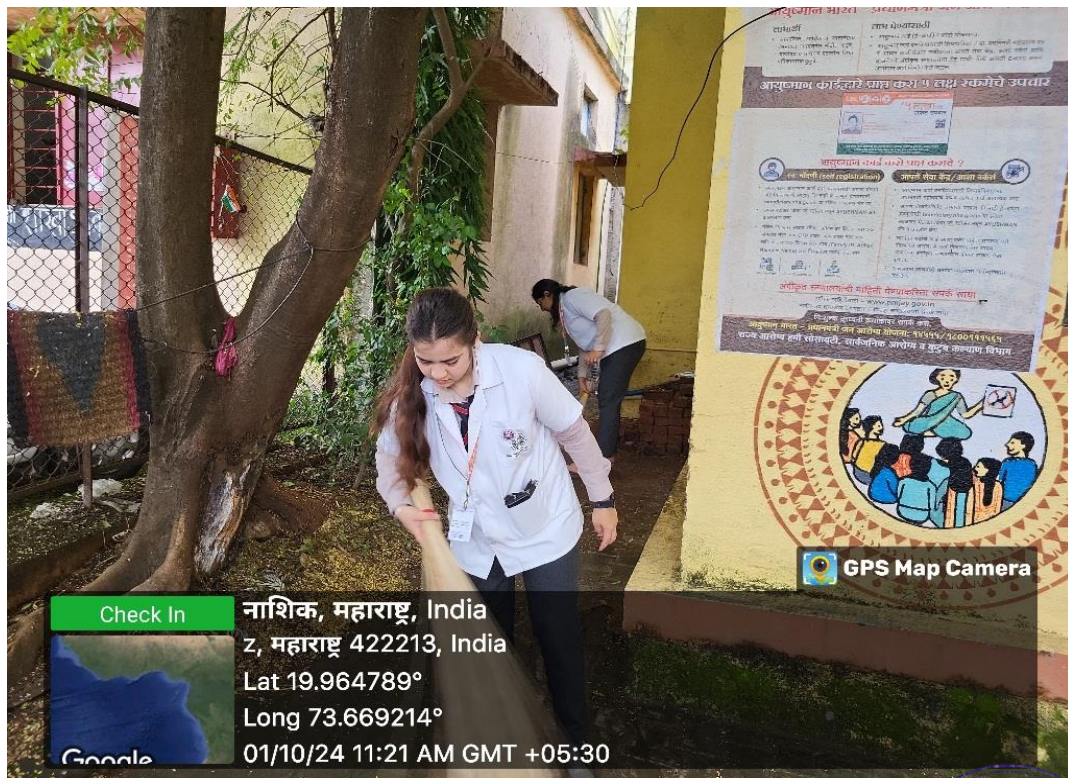

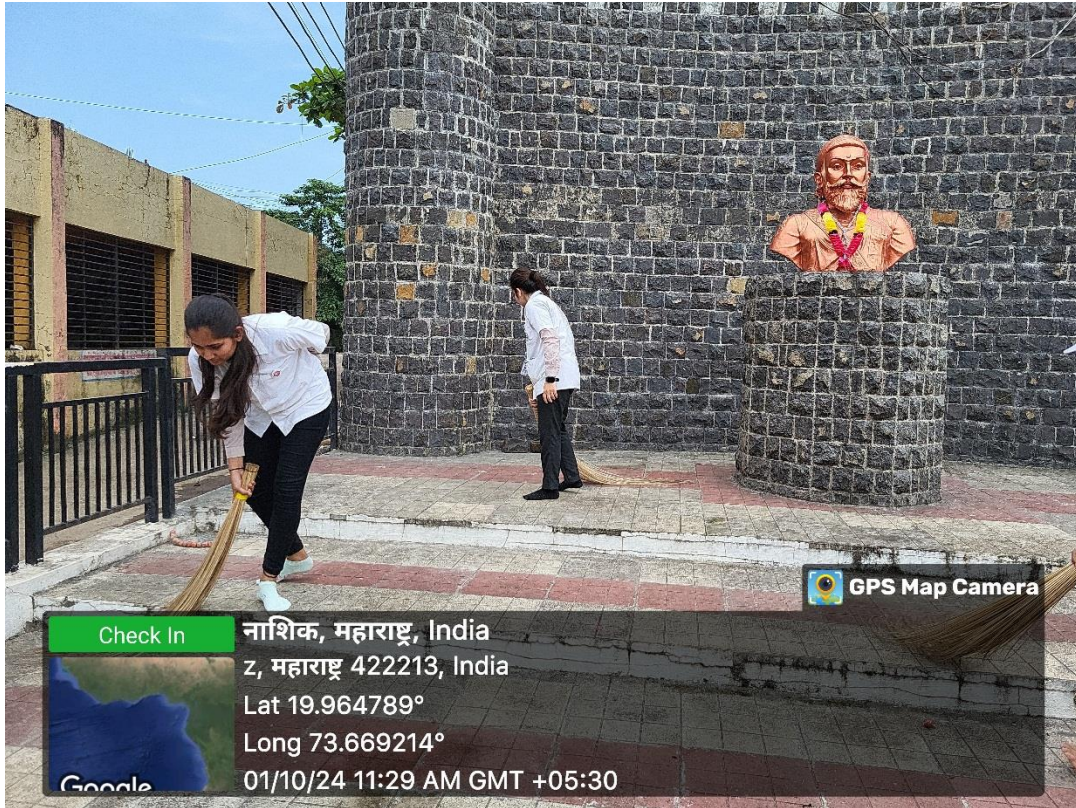

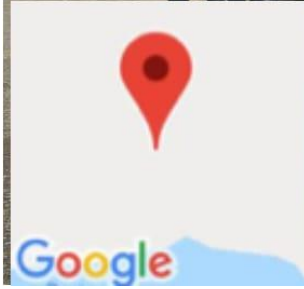
